**1. Grant to Develop Community-Based
Agricultural Extension and Training for Viet
Nam**

Hanoi - 4 August 2006: ADB and the Government of Viet Nam today signed a grant project that will disseminate improved agricultural technology and information to help reduce poverty in remote and isolated mountainous parts of the country.

The US\$900,000 grant is provided by the Japan Fund for Poverty Reduction (JFPR), financed by the Government of Japan. The Government of Viet Nam will contribute \$80,000 toward the project's total cost.

The JFPR project will undertake, in poor and mountainous districts of two provinces in the northern central region - Nghe An and Thanh Hoa provinces - a series of community-based programs to develop agriculture and

income-generating activities for local communes. It will strengthen skills of grassroots extension staff and develop farmer-to-farmer learning networks, and promote new methods of planning and evaluation.

The project complements a proposed Agriculture Science and Technology (AST) Project that will strengthen Viet Nam's agriculture science and technology system (research, extension, and rural-based training).

ADB and Centre d' Etude et de Cooperation Internationale (CECI), a Canadian non-government organization, jointly developed the project, drawing primarily on CECI's experience with a project to improve livelihoods for mountainous communities financed by Canada in Viet Nam's central region.

"Integrated approaches to agricultural extension and training are still rare in Viet Nam, where the state-managed system guided by the

central Government is predominant," says Ayumi Konishi, ADB's Country Director for Viet Nam.

"The project particularly targets mountainous areas where ethnic minorities make up the majority of the population, poverty rates are high, and social development initiatives are strongly needed."

It will be closely coordinated with the Government's national programs for socioeconomic development in the most disadvantaged communes.

The JFPR was set up in 2000 with an initial contribution of \$90 million, followed by additional contributions totaling \$155 million in 2002, and annual contributions up to 2006, bringing the total amount to \$360 million.

ADB, based in Manila, is dedicated to reducing poverty in the Asia and Pacific region through pro-poor sustainable economic growth, social development, and good governance. Established in 1966, it is owned by 66 members - 47 from the region. In 2005, it approved loans and technical assistance totaling \$6.95 billion and \$198.8 million, respectively.

2. About 1,900 billion VND required for programme on land supplies for ethnic minorities

Funding required for Programme 134 which will provide minority people with housing, land for housing and production, and safe water in the next two years was estimated to cost from 1,800-1,900 billion VND, according to the Finance Ministry. At a conference to review Programme 134 held by the National Assembly Council for Ethnic Minorities in Ha Noi on Aug. 21, the representative of the Finance Ministry said that for many reasons, the implementation of Programme 134 in many provinces had so far met only around half of its target.

Scattered settlements of people in many mountainous provinces and areas inhabited by ethnic minorities had made the cost of transporting materials and equipment higher than that provided for by the Government. In addition, a number of poor provinces, including Lai Chau and Dien Bien, had failed to pay 2 percent of the cost as required under the programme.

The representative of the Finance Ministry has suggested that the Government adjust its goal of completing the programme by 2008.

After two years, Programme 134 has helped improve the living conditions of ethnic minorities in poor and remote areas to a significant degree.

3. USD 875 million of ODA disbursed as of July 2006

Hanoi: According to the Ministry of Planning and Investment, as of July 2006, Vietnam has disbursed about USD 875 million of ODA sources, among which the loans and grants are of about USD 764 million and about USD 111 million, respectively.

The disbursement includes funds from the Japan Bank for International Cooperation (JBIC) as the first, the Asian Development bank (ADB) the second and the World Bank (WB) the third, which are of around USD 610 million, accounting for 80% of the total disbursed funds.

MPI adds, the new loan projects have increased the total of ODA funds as agreed with donors in July to a number of USD 1,599 billion, among which the loans are of USD 1.466 million and grants of about 133 million.

4. UNDP project gives local officials training in planning

Hanoi-Aug - Administrators of four provinces - Vinh Phuc and Bac Kan in the north, Quang Nam, in the center, and Tra Vinh, in the south, underwent instruction in strategic planning yesterday.

The instruction - part of four-year US\$ 4 million "United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) project- is designed to help local officials device and implement socio-economic development plans and manage personnel.

The project, which began in June 2006 and will end in June 2009, is designed to help perfect national policy and is part of the Viet Nam Government's decentralization programme.

The lectures were given by UNDP personnel. The agency's personnel will also

provide a five-day training course dealing with the detailed steps for devising strategic plans to technical employees from the four provinces during this month.

5. Australia eyes dairy cow project in Ho Chi Minh City

HCM City-Aug 2006: A delegation of South-Australia state visited Ho Chi Minh City, studying the activities of the city's people council, social policies and infrastructure.

According to Jack Snelling, Head of South Australian state's people council, dairy cow and post-harvest preservation of products in Ho Chi Minh City are fields of great interest to the state. Therefore, Australian side requested to increase information exchange, promoting the friendly and co-operative relations, trade and investment relations between Ho Chi Minh City and South-Australia state.

According to the Chairman of Ho Chi Minh City People's council, the city is strengthening the supervision and gathering ideas of residents to make amendment and adjustment more suitable to people's living conditions. Besides, the city also considers and issues social policies for the sake of poor people like education, creating jobs, free health-check and etc financed by social funds.

6. Delta gets VND2,000 billion for water management

The Government would set aside VND2,000 billion for water management and aquaculture in the Cuu Long Delta next year. The amount would be disbursed by yearend according to the Southwest Steering Committee.

This is the ever largest investment for water management works which serve aquaculture in the region. Though water management works for rice cultivation are paid much attention, those for aquaculture are in poor conditions. As a result, the environment is polluted in many localities, causing bad impacts on aquatic production. The huge investment thus is hoped to improve the situation.

7. More than \$43m needed to upgrade reservoirs

Hanoi - August: The Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development has asked the Government to allocate VND700 billion (over US\$43 million) to repair and upgrade 120 unsafe reservoirs across the country this year.

The ministry has also instructed the Department of Water Resources, in coordination with local authorities, to make regular check-ups and repair the irrigation networks during the wet season.

Viet Nam has nearly 2,000 reservoirs providing water for 500,000 ha of farming land, for daily life and producing electricity.

However, 50 per cent of them, which were built in the 1970s, are seriously degraded, especially those in the mountainous areas like Dau Tieng in southern Tay Ninh Province, Ke Go in central Ha Tinh Province, Phu Ninh in central Quang Nam Province, Pa Khoang in northern Lai Chau Province and Cam Son in northern Lang Son Province.

8. Farm processing industry's revenue increases

Hanoi: The agricultural processing industry registered a production revenue of 5.25 trillion VND (328 million USD) during the first seven months of this year, an annual increase of 10 percent, according to the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development.

In particular, food processing recorded a revenue of 397 billion VND (24.8 million USD) in July, an annual increase of 11.5 percent.

Increases were also seen in the processing of sugar, farm produce and veterinary medicines.

However, salt processing only recorded 600,000 tonnes, a 35 percent decrease from the same period last year, mainly due to natural disasters. Salt prices remained stable in northern and central provinces, but surged in the south.

9. Government Pumps \$201.25m Into Flood Prevention In Mekong Delta

Hanoi, August 9, 2006: The government of Vietnam has to date poured VND3.2 trillion (\$201.25 million) into flood prevention in eight

localities in the Mekong Delta, said the Steering Committee for Southwestern Region.

The finance has benefited 164 communes with high risks of flash floods in Long An, Dong Thap, An Giang, Kien Giang, Tien Giang, Hau Giang and Vinh Long provinces and Can Tho City.

So far, 60,835 flood-resistant houses have been built, fulfilling 40.6% of the target of 149,715 houses; while 58,687 out of 94,718 selected households have already moved to safe places, meeting 49% of the set target..

All authorized forces have also taken drastic measures to make good preparedness for the incoming flood season, including repairing roads, raising foundations of houses, completing clean water supply stations and building flood-prevention dyke works.

The Mekong Delta region comprising 13 cities and provinces is home to about 18 million people or 21.7% of Vietnam's population with 1.3 million people of Khmer ethnic minority.

At present, a vast of regional people are living under the poverty line in the wake of consecutive flash floods.

10. Japan to support rubber sub-sectors of four ASEAN countries

Japan will support the natural rubber production of the four countries in Mekong River region, including Vietnam, Laos, Cambodia and Myanmar.

In accordance with Yomiuri Newspaper (Japan), Japan's Minister of Economy-Trade and Industry, Toshihiro Nikai, will publicize this plan at the ASEAN-Japan Economic Ministerial Meeting to be held on 23 August in Malaysia.

The purpose of this plan is to support the four countries to increase their production as well as the quality of natural rubber products in order to meet the increasing demand of the world market.

Under the estimation of the International Rubber Research Association, world's demand for rubber in the next 30 years will be doubled compared to the current, to 15 million tons/year.

11. Ministry sets high target for FDI flow

Ha Noi - 22-08-2006:— The Ministry of Planning and Investment (MPI) has set an ambitious target of luring a capital of around US\$7 billion from foreign direct investment (FDI) next year, requiring significant efforts from the ministry and provinces nationwide.

Director of the Foreign Investment Agency (FIA) under the MPI Phan Huu Thang said the MPI was, currently, considering issuing licences for several large projects worth billions of US dollars as a result of significant and positive changes in luring FDI to the country.

"Facing fierce competition from countries in the region in attracting FDI, the MPI, provinces and cities have been approaching potential investors for investing in Viet Nam," he said.

"Japan, the US, European countries, South Korea, Singapore are considered key investors for the country."

According to experts, the Common Investment Law, which came into effect in the beginning of July, will affect FDI prospects positively as it underscores the country's commitment in providing a level-playing field for both domestic and overseas investors.

Besides, the country's agreements with other WTO's members as it accedes to the World Trade Organisation (WTO) will boost foreign investor confidence in Viet Nam.

The MPI and ministries concerned are planning to hold several conferences from now to the end of the year for inviting FDI, and cities and provinces are going abroad for inviting foreign investors to Viet Nam.

The nation will also open investment promotion offices at several countries such as the US, Japan and European countries and set up a fund for investment promotion.

Besides, the list of sectors requiring FDI in the next five years will be announced soon, Thang said, adding that Viet Nam aims to attract \$6 billion in FDI this year.

Ha Noi seeks FDI

The capital has called for FDI in high technology and building high-end hotels, focusing on the west of West Lake in the city.

During the first half of the year, the city has attracted 73 newly foreign-invested projects and 19 additional capital projects worth more than US\$741million, reported the Ha Noi Planning and Investment Department.

During the same period, the department advised the Ministry of Planning and Investment to withdraw licenses of 49 foreign-invested projects and help 23 others overcome financial and organisational difficulties.

Ha Noi investment authorities plan to simplify administrative procedures in a bid to attract greater foreign investment. By the end of this year, authorities will establish a team to implement a "one-stop" policy for licensing foreign-invested projects. The "one-stop" policy will help facilitate a number of large projects including a 65-storey building, a 100-bed hospital and a CDMA-2000 mobile phone service.

12. Positive signs in FDI flow in southern region

The flow of foreign direct investment (FDI) into the southern key economic region has shown signs of a new boom with a series of projects ranging from tens of millions to hundreds of millions of USD in capital.

The southern economic hub of HCM City has licensed a 249 million USD project by the Saigon Central Container Port Company to build a container port in the city in the Hiep Phuoc Industrial Zone, around 10 km from downtown Ho Chi Minh City. The terminal is capable of handling 1.5 million TEU, or the equivalent of 30 million tonnes of cargo a year.

Meanwhile, a joint venture between the Sai Gon Port and APM Terminals of Finland plans to start the construction of a container port in the south of the city by the end of the year. The port is expected to be operational by mid 2009.

At a meeting with the city's leaders, President Park Sam Koo of Kumho Asiana Group from the Republic of Korea informed them of their plan to build the Asiana Plaza - a complex of office, hotel and commercial facilities - with an investment capital of 230 million USD.

The Kumho Asiana Group will also simultaneously build an automobile tyre plant in southern Binh Duong province as the plant will have an investment capital of 300 million USD and a designed annual capacity of 3.15 million tyres.

Domestic investors are also accelerating the pace of many projects, either with their own investment capital or in the form of joint venture.

The Viet Nam Steel Corporation is speeding up the establishment of a joint venture with India's Essar Steel to build a 500 million USD hot-rolled steel plant in southern Ba Ria-Vung Tau province. The factory has a projected annual output of 2 million tonnes of steel.

A joint venture between the Thanh Long Tourism and the Viet Thang Company will start work on the 900 million USD Sea Dragon Hill tourist site in Dat Do district, Ba Ria-Vung Tau province, early next year.

13. Viet Nam encourages investment in dairy cows

Viet Nam is encouraging all economic sectors to invest in breeding dairy cows and increase the milk output for domestic demand, according to an animal husbandry agency.

Investors in dairy cows will be provided with preferences in taxes and land use and with favourable treatments in applying for bank loans, according to a spokesman for the Animal Husbandry Department under the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development.

Viet Nam has a target to double its number of dairy cows to around 200,000 and to produce 350,000 tonnes of milk annually to the year 2010 so as to be able to meet around 33 percent of its domestic demand.

Last year, the country produced nearly 198,000 tonnes of milk, 48,000 tonnes more than the annual target. However, this was still only enough to satisfy 20-22 percent of domestic demand, the department said.

Over the past few years, Viet Nam has coordinated with many international organisations in running training courses on the dairy cow industry for technicians from the central to grassroots levels.

As part of the programmes, the National Institute of Animal Husbandry is carrying out a project funded by the Japan International Cooperation Agency to improve dairy cow raising techniques. The project began in April this year and will run through to March 2011.

Over recent years, dairy products made by local companies have been sold well not only in domestic but also in foreign markets, including Iraq, China, Cuba and Myanmar. The export value of Viet Nam's dairy products has

increased steadily, reaching over 80 million USD last year.

The Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development has predicted that in the immediate future, domestic dairy products will continue to dominate the Vietnamese market, with a 70-90 percent market share, although they will face much greater competition from low-taxed overseas competitors when Viet Nam joins the World Trade Organization.

14. Viet Nam to grow 2 billion more trees

Viet Nam will have additional 2 billion trees grown dispersedly in the 2006-2010 period, according to a greening project recently approved by the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development (MARD).

The project, one of the activities to maintain and develop the tree planting movement initiated years ago by President Ho Chi Minh, aims to reduce barren land acreage and provide more finished wood products for consumption.

It will also help to promote the effective use of the country's land fund and create more jobs for local people as well as protect the ecological environment.

According to MARD, Viet Nam has 12.6 million ha of land covered by forests or 37 percent. The four provinces with a forest coverage rate of over 60 percent include Tuyen Quang, Quang Binh, Kon Tum and Lam Dong.
